

## About Camp de Benneville Pines

Located at 6800 feet in the San Bernardino National Forest, de Benneville is surrounded by towering ponderosa pines, oaks and cedars. Barton Creek is nearby and Jenks Lake within walking distance. It is the perfect location to enjoy the natural beauty of the forest.

Delicious meals are served in Homet Lodge, with vegetarian/vegan entrees offered if requested with registrations. Cabins are comfortable if rustic, with shared bathrooms and showers. Dorms sleep six, cabin rooms sleep four and deluxe accommodations include a shared kitchen and sitting area. A limited number of double beds are also available.

## Photo Camp: Landscape Photography

*Learn to Take Great Photographs  
Instead of Snapshots  
With Your Digital Camera!*



The emphasis of Photo Camp is to teach campers how to take a great image with a digital camera. Led by professional landscape painter and photographer Greg Zook, Photo Camp participants will learn about composition, lighting, contrast, focus and depth of field. You will learn how to get the most out of your specific camera and when to use manual settings for more control and flexibility.

Each day begins with a pre-breakfast photo hike to take advantage of the beautiful early morning light. After breakfast, you can practice photo techniques, complete assignments, or attend the general PSWIRL keynote speaker and workshops. During an afternoon lecture, Greg will discuss photographic concepts, show illustrations of techniques, review campers' photos, and demonstrate the photo-

graphic exercise for the next day. He will go over specifics for each participant's camera as well. The rest of the afternoon and evening will be available to attend general PSWIRL activities or shoot more photographs.



Wednesday afternoon, participants will work with Greg to create a slide show of their best photographs for presentation to the rest of the camp on Thursday evening.

There will be no printing or working with the computer to correct a bad image after it has been taken. Use of a tripod is recommended but not essential.

Join us for an intensive individualized photography experience.
